- **Admission & Fee Module:** This module facilitates the Admission process in which the candidate's admission is done using Computers at the Admission counters. The Computer operator at the counters fills the basic information and course details and the application generate the Fee receipt, which is printed and provided to the Candidate. This module also facilitates to update the Course Fee every year if the fee is amended.
- **Merit List Module:** This module facilitates the generation of Merit list for admission in U.G. & P.G. classes. This module automatically generates the merit based on the various criteria made by the college administration. This module also considers the Reservation criteria as per the Governments norms.
- **Identity Card Module:** This module facilitates the generation and printing of Identity Cards of the admitted students. The module speeds up the process of Identity Card printing which in turn helps the Proctorial Board for better control of discipline in the College Campus.
- **Scholar Register Module:** This module facilitates the generation and printing of Scholar Register every year. Scholar Register is a very important document for the office that keeps track of yearly progress of the student. This module automatically generates the details of students, which is required in the Scholar register when the student is admitted in the College in the 1st year.
- **Transfer & Character Certificate Module:** Transfer Certificate & Character Certificate are the certificates issued to the students when they leave the College. The application has a dedicated module for generating and issuing Transfer Certificate & Character Certificate to the students leaving the Institution.
- **Academic activities Module:** Department wise seminars, conference, debate, quiz, extempore, model competition etc. organized in college for the academic enhancement of students. Industrial visits and personality development programmes also implied in academic flourishing.

1.1 Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 Institution has the mechanism for well-planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Jhunjhunwala PG College, Ayodhya is presently affiliated to Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Ayodhya, U.P. and follows the curricula designed and developed by the university. The curriculum is designed and developed by the university keeping in mind the objectives and guidelines provided by UGC/MHRD/state government. There is annual system of examination in UG&PG courses in humanities, Science, Commerce, B. Ed. & M. Ed. There is semester system in BBA & BCA courses. According to the need of the society, guidelines provided by government for global competence, the members recommend the modification in the curriculum to the academic council for approval. In the whole process of curriculum, Planning and Implementation, teachers of the college have played a major role as deans, conveners and members. Some faculty members are invited as resource persons to these and other related academic events. College ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well-planned and documented process. The college has designed certain value aided and certificate programmes of short duration related to personality and skill development of students. IQAC prepares the academic calendar of the college prior to the commencement of every academic year. The academic calendar devises suitable dates for significant academic and other activities. The faculty members are briefed on the academic activities of the college on the first meeting of the commencement of every academic year. The head of the departments arranges departmental meetings to distribute and assign the workload. Faculty members prepare their teaching plan for theory and practical at the beginning of session. Each teacher is provided with an academic diary containing timetable, workload, Annual/Semester teaching plan, actual teaching units, daily teaching plan, and academic and administrative committee responsibilities. The academic diary is monitored by the concerned head of departments and the principal of the college.

The timetable committee prepares a general timetable for UG & PG classes. Teachers conduct classes as per the timetable provided by the college. For the effective transmission and delivery of curricula, departments integrate classroom teaching with various ICT tools, laboratory practical, field projects, students seminars, tutorials, previous years and sample question papers solving exercises, field survey etc. There are well-equipped laboratories available for imparting better understanding of the subject. For the up gradation of subject-related knowledge, college organizes seminars, conferences, and workshops. This activity provides a platform to the faculty and the students to participate and interact with experts in various fields and enrich and update their subject knowledge. For the effective curriculum delivery teachers' use participative, problem solving and student-centric learning methods. Faculties effectively

and creatively use PPTs, video lectures, models, charts are available to the students for delivering the subject knowledge. The college organizes guest lectures, expert lectures of eminent academicians for the effective curriculum delivery. At the end of every academic year, IQAC collects feedback on curricula from all the stakeholders, it is then analyzed and analysis report is communicated to Head of the institution.

STUDENT FEEDBACK FOR DESIGN AND REVIEW OF SYLLABUS

As part of the process improvement initiative, the IQAC of Jhunjhunwala P.G. College administered a survey in the month January 2020 that evaluates students' feedback for design and review of syllabus. It will provide opportunities to monitor changes across the years in a range of ways. This report presents a summary of results.

Objectives

- To measure students' level of satisfaction with the design and review of syllabus.
- To identify existing problems, if any, and recommend changes.

Method

Instrument

The Student Feedback Survey was prepared using, in general. The survey questions have been developed in light of existing college practices. The expectation is that college will retain this open text data and use it for its own analysis.

The Survey included the following components:

Items soliciting students' opinion and perception for the syllabus in the reference of –

- Quality of the syllabus
- Students' learning outcomes and development.
- Career perspective
- Teaching resources, material and environment

Sample

The sample initially consisted of undergraduate and postgraduate students from all the four verticals (Science, Arts, Commerce, Teacher & Physical Education). Total students are 2226 (Two thousand two hundred twenty six).

Administration

Survey was administered in classrooms. Instructors of selected course sections were contacted and their support was solicited.

Student Feedback in Science Department

Total 641 students have given the feedback to the science teachers from different disciplines. Students verified the teachers on the basis of their teaching method, study content provided by them, punctuality in the classroom, discipline, co-curricular activities, teaching based on new research & course coverage etc. After evaluation of the feedback form, analysis shows the result in below Table No. 1. The evaluation shows student satisfaction level is quite good that is of A-grade quality.

Some teachers use YouTube platform to deliver their lectures, in some laboratories we are having overhead projectors to teach the students; we provide PowerPoint presentation to the students. Students also participate in seminars and give very effective powerpoint presentation.

During the COVID-19 pandemic our college used Zoom online platform to give the virtual classes to our students from April 2020-July 2020. By using various online platforms like google meet, teams and zoom our college organized various Webinars through which not only our college students get benefited but also students and faculty from all over India joined the webinar and enhanced their experience and learning.

The institute adopts continuous off line students mentoring system and due to pandemic of COVID-19 online mentoring also available

Mentoring of students is conducted by the full time teachers of the departments of the institution. Students have been allotted to each full time teacher by the department. The formal student mentoring system has been introduced in the academic session 2019-2020. IQAC has been trusted to preserve the records of the mentoring system as received from the departments and to provide necessary assistance and suggestions to the departments as and when required.

Mentoring of students is based on following objectives:

- Increasing teacher-student contact hours
- Identifying and addressing the problems faced by slow learners and first generation learners
- Encouraging advanced learners with additional resources
- Decreasing the student drop-out rates

<p>The Institution has a well established mechanism for internal and external audit of all financial transactions every year to ensure financial compliance. Internal audit is conducted half yearly by the internal financial committee of the institution comprising Senior and Junior Accountants of the college. The committee thoroughly verifies the income and expenditure details and the compliance report of internal audit is submitted to the management of the institution through principal. External audit is conducted once in every year by an external agency. The mechanisms used to monitor effective and efficient use of financial resources are as below:</p> <p>1. Budget Allocation: Before the commencement of every financial year, principal submits a proposal on budget allocation, by considering the recommendations made by the heads of all the departments, to the management.</p> <p>2. Disbursement of Allocated Money: College budget includes recurring expenses such as salary, electricity, internet charges, maintenance cost, stationery, other consumable charges etc., and non-recurring expenses like lab equipment purchases, furniture and other development expenses.</p> <p>3. Internal Audit: The expenses will be monitored by the accounts department as per the budget allocated by the</p>			

management.

4. The depreciation costs of various things purchased in the preceding years are also worked out. Process of the internal audit: All vouchers are audited by an internal financial committee on half yearly basis. The expenses incurred under different heads are thoroughly checked by verifying the bills and vouchers. If any discrepancy is found, the same is brought to the notice of the principal and Management. The same process is being followed for the last five years.

5. Process of the external audit: The accounts of the college are audited by chartered accountant regularly as per the government rules. The auditor ensures that all payments are duly authorized after the audit, the report is sent to the management for review. Any queries, in the process of audit would be attended immediately along with the supporting documents within the prescribed time limits. The institution did not come across with any major audit objection during the preceding years. All these mechanisms exhibit the transparency being maintained in financial matters and adherence to financial discipline to avoid defalcation of funds or properties of the institution at all levels. The audited statement is duly signed by the authorities of the management and chartered accountant.
